Fieldwork for ED 425 requires a **minimum of 60 hours** in a high school classroom in a Chicago Public School. The hours you will spend in a CPS high school this semester are an important step in becoming a licensed teacher, and need to take a priority in your semester schedule. Your field experience in this course will involve a considerable amount of time in a school. You will be observing classes, working with your cooperative teacher, and teaching 5-10 of your own lessons. It is important that you have a minimum three hour, 3-5 days a week block of time available to devote to your field experiences.

Please note that these preferences will be taken into account for your school placement, but are not guaranteed. Students are placed in schools with quality mentor teachers in CPS high schools where UIC has established partnerships. When approaching your observation hours this semester, consider the fact that Chicago Public Schools spans a city of 234 square miles and includes over 100 high schools. The average commute time in Chicago is over 30 minutes, and it is likely that you commute will reflect this average, depending on where you live. Organizing these placements takes a tremendous amount of time and energy, as teachers and principals agree to welcome UIC teacher candidates into their schools and classrooms and take on the work of mentoring future teachers. For this reason, please note that **once school placements are assigned, they will not be changed**. Students will be notified of their field placements once the course begins.
